an effort to come along for some fun. Proceeds go to Wellbeing North Canterbury.



Banner Stories

For years we have sat at our tea meetings with rows upon rows of banners around us... but where are they from?

Fukushima Liberty Lions Club

Fukushima is a prefecture of Japan located in the Tōhoku region of Honshu. It has a population of 1,848,257. Fukushima is the third-largest prefecture of Japan. The coastal region traditionally specializes in fishing and seafood industries, and is notable for its electric and particularly

nuclear power-generating industry, while the upland regions are more focused on agriculture.

On March 11, 2011, a magnitude 9.0 earthquake occurred off the coast. The earthquake triggered a massive tsunami that hit the eastern coast of the prefecture and caused widespread destruction and loss of life. 1,817 residents

of Fukushima Prefecture died as a result. The Fukushima nuclear disaster caused significant damage. Two of the six reactors at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant exploded followed by a partial meltdown and fires at three of the other units.

The Fukushima Lions Club meets twice a month on the first and third Wednesday.


