PP Pam's Governor Elect Trip to St Charles, Chicago, Illinois: As part of her training towards becoming a District Governor, Pam had recently been to St Charles, outside Chicago, with almost 700 other DG trainees from around the world and it has reinforced for her the global nature of the difference that Lions together can make at that global level.

But just as importantly, as she talked with individuals from a huge variety of cultures, she realised that in our clubs, no matter what we look like, what we wear, or how we live, we are all working for the same goal – to make change, to make a difference in our own communities, wherever in the world they are.

Cancer Screening Bus: There is fantastic news on this front. A huge thanks to the 69 Lions clubs who have raised over \$200k to date, together with a grant of approx. \$125k from LCIF. The timeline for this first vehicle to be operational is the summer of 2024-25. Our screening bus will be an Iveco vehicle but slightly longer.

There are still opportunities for more clubs to get involved. The reason being, we are looking forward towards a second vehicle. Once we have fundraised up to a certain level, we are eligible to apply for a further grant from LCIF to assist with this 2nd screening vehicle.



Rowing For Life Aotearoa: Just a quick update, the Rowing for Life Coastal Rowing Adventure has travelled all the way to Kaikoura - over 600km rowed. Unfortunately, they must postpone the journey due to some of the team having covid.



They have returned home to recover and undertake maintenance on the coastal rowing equipment. We will have to wait and see what happens next, but we will endeavour to keep you updated on this venture.

As the International Convention is in our region this year, it is an ideal time to fly over the ditch and take part in it.



Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF): The LCIF grant funding will empower Lions to help victims recover.

Yet again another disaster is being supported by Lions International and LCIF, that is mobilising funds, to include a \$100k Major Catastrophe Grant, to support the Taipei Earthquake Disaster.

This struck the south of Taipei on 3rd April, causing at least 12 fatalities & 1,000 injuries, collapsed buildings, landslides, blackouts and had triggered tsunami warnings. This 7.4

magnitude quake was the strongest to hit the region in 25 years.
