We need more advertising (Both electronic and Physical) saying "We want YOU" I remember seeing this on a wall in Halswell This is what we should be doing.



My wife doesn't work...

Conversation between a husband (M) and a psychologist (P):

P: What do you do for a living, Mr. Rogers?

M: I am an accountant in a bank...

P: And your wife?

M: She doesn't work. She's a stay-at-home mom.

P: Who prepares breakfast for your family?

M: My wife, since she doesn't work.

P: What time does your wife wake up in the morning?

M: She wakes up very early since things have to be organized. She prepares lunches for the children, she makes sure they are well dressed and combed, that they have eaten, brushed their teeth and collected all their school belongings. She wakes up with the baby, changes his diaper and breastfeeds him.

P: How do your children get to school?

M: My wife drives them to school, since she doesn't work.

P: After driving the children to school, what does she do?

M: She goes to the supermarket to buy groceries or she does shopping for the house. Sometimes she forgets something and has to do the whole trip again with the crying baby. Once she returns home, she has to feed and breastfeed the baby, change his diaper and prepare him for a nap, clean the house and do the laundry. You know, since she doesn't work.

P: In the evening, when you come back from the office, what do you do?

M: I'm resting, of course. I'm exhausted from my long day of work at the bank.

P: What does your wife do in the evening?

M: She cooks dinner, serves us food, washes the dishes, cleans the house and walks the dog. After helping the children with their homework, she gets them ready for bed and checks that they have brushed their teeth. Then she changes the baby's diaper and breastfeeds him again. When she is in bed, she wakes up regularly to breastfeed and change diapers as needed, since she does not have to get up to go to work.

This is the daily routine of many women around the world. It starts at dawn and continues until the wee hours of the morning... and it's called "don't work"?!

Being a stay-at-home mom may not require a degree, but it is an essential family role! Appreciate your wife, your mother, your grandmother, your aunt, your sister or your daughter... because their sacrifices are priceless.

Someone asked me...

"Are you a working woman, or are you just a stay-at-home mom?" »

I answered :

I am a woman who works at home, 24 hours a day...

I am a mother,

I'm a woman,

I am a girl, I am an alarm clock, I am the cook. I am the housekeeper, I am the mistress of the house, I'm the waitress, I am the nurse, I am a nurse. I am a manual worker, I am a security guard, I am the advisor. I am the comforter, I don't have any time off, I work day and night, I am still on duty, I don't get paid and...

Even then, I often hear the phrase: **"But what do you do all day?"** » In tribute to all women who dedicate their lives to the well-being of their families.

Tell a new story

New Zealand has the highest reported rate of intimate partner violence in the OECD. 24% of women and 6% of men will experience a sexual assault in their lifetime. Media stories of family and sexual violence, including deaths, are commonplace. So why do most of us continue to behave as if it's not our problem, as if these statistics are OK? We can all become part of the solution when we recognise that our collective tolerance is part of the problem.

We need to stop making gendered assumptions about people; women and girls are not intrinsically vulnerable to violence, men and boys are not intrinsically violent or aggressive. Harmful assumptions founded on social stereotypes maintain gender inequalities and intergenerational violence.

Baking soda is a gardener's best friend: here are 10 clever uses in the garden.

1. Natural Fungicide: Mix baking soda with water and liquid soap to spray on plants and combat fungal diseases like powdery mildew.

2. Weed Killer: Directly apply baking soda on garden weeds to kill them without harming surrounding plants.

3. Pest Deterrent: A mixture of baking soda and flour can deter pests like cabbage worms and aphids when dusted on plants.

4. Soil Amendment: Baking soda can be used to neutralize overly acidic soil, improving the environment for plant growth.

5. Tomato Sweetener: Sprinkle baking soda around tomato plants to decrease soil acidity, resulting in sweeter tomatoes.

6. Compost Enhancer: Speed up the composting process by making the environment more alkaline with baking soda.

7. Odor Absorber: Neutralize odors in areas like compost bins by sprinkling baking soda.

8. Tool Cleaner: Clean gardening tools by scrubbing them with a baking soda paste to remove dirt and rust.

9. Seed Germination: Enhance seed germination by soaking seeds in a baking soda solution before planting.

10. Ant Repellent: Deter ants by creating barriers with baking soda around plants or ant trails.



President's Message Changing the World with International President Dr. Patti Hill


Dear Lion,
