



Eulogy given by Donald Lemon on the passing of Lion Geoff Warren





"Ellesmere Lions Club has lost a very valued member.

Geoff joined in 1992 giving us 32 years of service. He held many positions in the club over the years.

He was President for the 1998 – 99 years.

For many years he organised the local telephone directory, that the Lions produced as a fund raiser. He was always looking for ways to improve and had a gift of finding the right people in the right places to help. The last one we were able to produce he contacted the local schools and instigated a competition to design the cover. It was a very successful idea with parents becoming involved and thus selling 300 plus extra directories.

In the early years the club sent many disadvantaged children to Disneyland through a scheme run by the National Lions Clubs. Geoff thought about this wonderful idea and inquired had we thought of rewarding our young students who are achievers. Hence our Ellesmere College scholarship was born.

Geoff was also our tail-twister. To those of you who are unfamiliar with this roll it is a kind of Sherriff who finds out about any mis demeaners that the members had committed.

The effort that Geoff put into this was amazing, even sometimes using elaborate props. Geoff also wrote a column in our monthly bulletin "Geoff's bits and pieces" The story usually started off with a certain amount of truth to identify the person involved, but then as his embellishments increased the percentage of the truth became somewhat less and less.


He didn't mind telling a story on himself. One such case was when a team from Lincoln Ventures was sent to Invercargill to check if the odours from the sewerage ponds were within the legal limits. Rather than use a boat to get out on the pond, Geoff thought the bucket of an excavator would suffice to get him over the said pond. He was to phone his mates to retrieve him when the job was done. After three hours his mates decided that they should see why he hadn't phoned. His reply was that he had the TV remote in his pocket and his phone was back in the hotel room.

Geoff was in his element designing floats for the Lions to enter in the Christmas Parade. Geoff and Warwick Hill both worked at Lincoln University. One day over lunch they discussed what they could do with an abandoned 1100 car that was behind the shed.

The plan was to cut it in half – stretch it and make a cage in the middle to put sheep in and call it "Cab – 4 – Ewe" After lunch Geoff went to get all the cutting and safety gear to find to his horror as he returned the car was already in half. Warwick had cut it in half with an axe.

Another float that he helped design was the Flintstone car. After it's outing in the Leeston Parade the Christchurch parade organisers asked Geoff if they could have it for their parade. From there it was spotted by the management of the Copthorne Hotel who got in touch with Geoff to inquire about putting it in their foyer for a Convention that they were having – the theme being "Safari".

Geoff was to get two free meals for the effort. He said that he couldn't accept this as his co-designer was Warwick Hill "Fred". So you want four meals. Will that be ok? No we need "Barney's" truck to get it there (that was me) As only Geoff could do we had six meals plus drinks on the Copthorne."
