With Convention looming there are several motions that need to be voted on, so that we can give our voting delegates the clubs mandate on how to proceed.

Motions:

Nominations and Remits: Convention 29 March 2025

"That the new Lions District 202E Constitution as provided to all clubs be adopted" Explanation:

All Incorporated Societies are required to re-register under the new Incorporated Societies Act by 2026.

Just as all lions clubs are Incorporated societies, so too is our district.

In the same way that the new club constitution to re-register clubs has been prepared by our Multiple District Office, so too has the new district constitution for each district to adopt and re-register under the new Incorporated Societies Act.

The new constitution was presented to the cabinet at the November meeting and was formally approved at that meeting with a unanimous resolution of cabinet that new constitution be adopted at this convention.

The new constitution complies with the requirements of the new Incorporated Societies Act. Approval of this convention by way of this remit is required so that the district can be re-registered under the new Incorporated Societies Act and ensure that the district is compliant with the legislation.

12 home fertilizers for plants that you can easily find at home

- 1. Banana peels rich in potassium, bury directly on the ground or row for a natural liquid fertilizer.
- 2. Used coffee grains perfect for acid soil loving plants such as roses or blueberries.

- 4. EPSOM salt dissolves a teaspoon in a liter of water to add magnesium to the ground.

- 10. Sea seaweed after rinsing them, cuts and mixing with the soil for minerals and natural growth hormones.

- 11. Vegetable remains cooks the remains and uses the water as a broth full of nutrients for your plants.
- 12. Herb tea boils herbs such as chamomile or ortiga to create a rich and natural fertilizer. These home fertilizers are not only economical, but also ecological.

I approached one of the boys on the field and asked (not expecting much) if Shay could play. The boy looked around for guidance and said, 'We're losing by six runs and the game is in the eighth inning. I guess he can be on our team and we'll try to put him in to bat in the ninth inning..' Shay struggled over to the team's bench and, with a broad smile, put on a team shirt.. I watched with a small tear in my eye and warmth in my heart. The boys saw my joy at my son being accepted.

In the bottom of the eighth inning, Shay's team scored a few runs but was still behind by three. In top of the ninth inning, Shay put on a glove and played in the right field. Even though no hits came his way, he was obviously ecstatic just to be in the game and on the field, grinning from ear to ear as I waved to him from the stands.

In the bottom of the ninth inning, Shay's team scored again. Now, with two outs and the bases loaded, the potential winning run was on base and Shay was scheduled to be next at bat.

At this juncture, do they let Shay bat and give away their chance to win the game? Surprisingly, Shay was given the bat. Everyone knew that a hit was all but impossible because Shay didn't even know how to hold the bat properly, much less connect with the ball.

However, as Shay stepped up to the plate, the pitcher, recognizing that the other team was putting winning aside for this moment in Shay's life, moved in a few steps to lob the ball in softly so Shay could at least make contact.

The first pitch came and Shay swung clumsily and missed. The pitcher again took a few steps forward to toss the ball softly towards Shay. At the pitch came in, Shay swung at the ball and hit a slow ground ball right back to the pitcher.

The game would now be over. The pitcher picked up the soft grounder and could have easily thrown the ball to the first baseman. Shay would have been out and that would have been the end of the game.

Never in his life had Shay ever run that far, but he made it to first base. He scampered down the baseline, wide-eyed and startled.

Mary Berry's Easy No-Bake Baileys Cheesecake

ingredients

- 250 g digestive biscuits, crushed
- 100 g unsalted butter, melted
- 600 g cream cheese, softened
- 150 g icing sugar, sifted
- 300 ml double cream
- 100 ml Baileys Irish Cream

1. prepare the base
