Returns!!

April is <u>Environmental Awareness</u> month so let's take a moment to think about recycling and the Lions NZ **KanTabs** project.

Metal recycling is vital for managing heavy, non-compactable materials like steel, aluminium, tin, copper, and brass offcuts. These materials should not go into general waste as they can be easily recycled if source-separated. Recycling metals conserves natural resources, reduces energy consumption, and lowers greenhouse gas emissions associated with metal production.

The <u>KanTabs</u> project involves Lions Clubs coordinating the collection of ring pull can tops, wine bottle screw tops & aluminium cans and then selling them to metal recycling firms and the proceeds going to <u>Kidney Kids NZ.</u>

Here are some interesting numbers to consider:

- 1 tonne / 72,000 soda/beer cans would raise around \$1,780
- 1 tonne/ 3,600,000 ring pulls would raise around \$500
- 1 tonne / 408,642 wine bottle tops would raise about \$1,300

1 person drinking just 1 can of liquid each day for a year generates 365 cans and ring pulls which could be recycled and a \$9.00 charity donation made. Multiply that just by our club members and the total raised would be \$207 and 8,395 cans that did not further pollute our environment.

So, please remember this information next Friday night when you settle down to enjoy your glass of wine or can of beer & consider recycling for **KanTabs.**
