### Candyfloss for the Eid al-Adha Festival 8/6/25



The Eid al-Adha festival is one of the 2 main festivals of Islam (the other festival is Eid al-Fitr). It will be held in the Wolfbrook Arena and anyone is welcome to attend. There will be many food vendors at the festival. The organisers have asked us if we will provide our candy floss machines. Warren will arrange for the candyfloss machines to be taken to the festival. Some of our members will make

the candyfloss in conjunction with festival volunteers.

#### **Environment Project/Membership Drive 21/6/25**

We will have a membership drive to coincide with National Volunteer Week which is 15 to 21 June. We are going to clean up the estuary and walking track area in South New Brighton. The environment is one of Lions International global causes. World Environment Day is in June.

We will invite people to join us by advertising thru social media, local newspaper, radio and local community groups. We will use New Brighton Facebook groups which have a total of 40,000 followers and Instagram. There will be notices in the Pegasus Post which is delivered to 16,000 households. We will ask volunteers to RSVP so we can maintain a register of who will be coming. We can then follow up to invite them to future projects or they may decide to become Lions.

We will meet at the car park beside the South New Brighton Community Hall, Beatty St. Start time is 10am and finish at 12pm. We will then have a free BBQ for the volunteers. The BBQ will be run by Christchurch East MP Reuben Davidson and his team. This will free us up to talk to volunteers about becoming a Lion or helping with future projects.

The Avon-Heathcote Estuary Trust will provide us with reusable bags and 60 pairs of gloves. They will arrange for all the rubbish collected to be taken to the refuse station with no cost to us.

#### **New Brighton Fireworks 5/7/25**

We are booked in to run a BBQ & candyfloss stall at the New Brighton Fireworks on 5/7/25. We should have the usual site in the car park beside the hot pools.

# 27<sup>th</sup> June is Helen Keller Day.

Now to get a day named for you takes quite a bit of work. So who was Helen Keller?

She was born on June 27<sup>th</sup> 1880 in a small town in Alabama USA and when she was only 19 months old, she contracted a fever that would leave her both deaf and blind. With the help of a dedicated teacher she not only learnt to read & write but at the age of 24 graduated from Harvard University with a degree. (No electronic typewriters, cell phones, voice recorders available back then!).

After graduation she began her life's work of helping blind and deaf-blind people. She appeared before state and national legislatures and international forums. She regarded herself as a "world citizen", visiting 39 countries on five continents between 1939 and 1957. She published 14 books and produced numerous articles. Not only was she out-spoken on the needs and issues affecting her fellow deaf and deaf-blind comrades, Helen was also a valiant supporter of women's suffrage, civil rights, and the labour union movement, as well as many other worth-while and important causes.


In 1925 she spoke to the Lions Clubs International Convention and challenged Lions to become "knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness". The various vision-related work projects initiated by LCI because of this courageous lady have now been running for 100 years, impacting millions of lives through various initiatives, including funding for research, education, and employment opportunities.

Now remember – <u>she was deaf & blind</u> whilst achieving all of this. Not so special?

**Try this for yourself** — wear a blindfold and try to just get a cup out of your cupboard & pour yourself a drink of cold water from the tap. Not so easy is it?


Approx 120 years ago - Seaview Road, New Brighton.
