I encourage all NZ Lions Clubs to plan an event or project this November in support of diabetes awareness and action.

One option is **Lap the Map**, a sponsored walk that's fun for the whole family. If your club takes part, I ask District GST Coordinators to collect their district's total kilometres walked and send them to me so we can share a combined NZ total.

In the Auckland area, Diabetes NZ also has a **mobile testing van** that can attend events to provide blood sugar screenings. Please note: **blood testing is a specialist role** and not something Lions should undertake directly.

A reminder that **diabetes is a core Lions project activity**. Be sure to record your service hours on the Lions website.
